Notes on Pollination:

- The two plums need each other for pollination
- Honeycrisp apple needs another apple for pollination (Sweet Sixteen apple)
- The Honeyberrys do best with a set of three different varieties for pollination
- The Anna Hardy kiwi needs a pollinator (kiwi pollinator)
