This is a list of cold hardy fruit varieties that should do well in the Big Horn Basin. Worland is in Zone 4b. Most of these are Zone 3 varieties.

There are many good sources of trees and other plants. I chose these vendors based on availability and price. There are more options if you want a full sized tree instead of a dwarf or semi-dwarf tree.

Notes on Pollination:

- The two plums need each other for pollination
- Honeycrisp apple needs another apple for pollination (Sweet Sixteen apple)
- The Honeyberrys do best with a set of three different varieties for pollination
- The Anna Hardy kiwi needs a pollinator (kiwi pollinator)
